





Colonel Amit R Dalvi is an Artillery officer. He was commissioned in Dec 1994. He is an alumnus of NDA and Services Preparatory Institute (SPI), Aurangabad, now Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar and after his premature retirement in Mar 2018, he worked as Director at the SPI till Nov 2024. Later he briefly worked at the Institute of Management and Technology, Nagpur. At present he is based at Mumbai, pursuing his hobbies and interests. He has been associated with Forces Network Post his retirement and is the cartoonist who makes people smile with his sketch in the E-Zine.



IQ: Please tell us something about your background prior to joining the Army, and your subsequent Army career. Please share any significant achievements?

Amit: I come from a civilian background. Childhood was spent in Mumbai. Looking

I studied up to class 10 in a Marathi medium school, Parle Tilak Vidyalaya, later joined the Services Preparatory Institute (SPI), Aurangabad, now known as Chhatrapati

Sambhaji Nagar, then the NDA, the IMA and then the Artillery, (73 Medium Regiment).

All these were the best and got these with little effort from my side.

A word about SPI. It is an Institute run by the Government of Maharashtra. It prepares young boys to be officers in the Indian Armed Forces. The God's have been very kind to me. I got to command the same Regiment and later got a chance to be the Director of my alma matar, the SPI. It was like dream come true.

Achievements are no different from typical fauji life. Most satisfying are those during career in the Army and later at the SPI and IMT, I was able to make a small difference for good. Like I said, I was lucky to have got the chance. So that is in nutshell a quick run down about my journey so far.



## IQ: Give us an understanding about your current role and what you are presently engaged in?

**Amit:** As said earlier, after taking premature retirement, I got an opportunity to work as the Director at the SPI. I served there till November 2022. After this tenure, I was briefly looking after administration at the Institute of Management and Technology (IMT) near Nagpur. At present, I have taken a break from all activities to look after my father. He had a brain stroke and now he needs attention.

# IQ: How did you become the Cartoonist of the ForceNet E-Zine? More importantly, considering it is a volunteer role what has kept you going month-on-month for more than 5 years?

Amit: When I became a member of the ForceNet, I was learning to draw cartoons. (To be honest, the process is still going on). I asked Colonel Iqbal Singh, if I can send my cartoons or sketches. He not only welcome the idea but has been encouraging me all along. He, along with the editorial team helped me in the on-boarding. My sketches were very basic. With passage of time and many trial and error, I could refine these to some level. It is very evident if we go through the sketches of the last five years. All these years, it has been lot of fun. With various interesting topics, the challenge of bringing something new and thus trying different things always kept me going. Guidance from other artists from our ForceNet too has been associated key factor. These five years have passed like a breeze, very satisfying one.

## IQ: Explain to us the process of creating a cartoon for the magazine each month? From where do you draw your creativity?

**Amit:** It is actually a family activity involving my wife and son. As soon as the theme is conveyed, we have a few discussions on dinner or breakfast table. During these, some old stories are remembered or some imaginary scenarios are painted. I remember when the theme was Camaraderie, discussion went from adventures of school days of all three of us, then to the NDA and even to the covert help in getting a senior married off to a Pune girl in and around the jungles of the North East. So we decided that it can not one picture and has to be a bunch of these.



Then there was a theme on Taming the Tiger and it required no discussion. Better Half gave the idea and it was completed in no time.

The COVID era was a testing time. All of us were at different places. In that period, the drawings, the discussions on the sketches kept us charged up in otherwise a gloomy situation.



IQ: Your cartoons have also evolved a lot over the past years. Have you undergone any professional training for drawing cartoons? Tell us about your evolution as a cartoonist over the past years?

**Amit:** Oh yes, cartoons have indeed evolved over the past years. It has been associated wonderful journey. You can easily make that out

Initially, I started with drawing on paper with a pen/ pencil. I soon moved on to adding colours and experimenting with various mediums. This was the time when my tenures in field helped me to practise and improve a bit.

Sometimes this hobby helped me to win instant friends and other times it yielded me wrath of some persons in the higher echelons. (This led to me picking up a pen name or shall I say, a brush name General Humour. It saved me a few embarrassments later).

Around 2014, I bought a second hand iPad with Apple Pencil. With help of some apps, it became an entertaining process all along. I had to unlearn and re-learn the whole new process.




Now-a-days I am back to paper and trying various types of ink plus brushes. - It is like reinventing the wheel all over again.

In certain things I have become a bit comfortable. And somethings, specially drawing women still remains a huge challenge for me. I am working on it. Going back to basics, is always an interesting phase in life. And now, I am exactly at that.













## IQ: here have been many famous cartoonists globally as well as in India? Anyone who has impressed you or anyone whose style has influenced you?

**Amit:** I started my journey when I was in the high school, with copying the cartoons from the famous cartoonists like Shri RK Laxman, Shri SD Fadnis, Shri Manjul, Shri Bal Thackeray and many others. The joy of making exact copy used to thrill me a lot then. Copying Indrajal comics and Astèrix (by illustrator Shri Albert Uderzo) still remains my all time favorites.

It took me some practice and guidance from some great creative minds, I was able progress a bit from copying to creating. I gradually shifted to drawing on my own.

Shri Mangesh Tendulkar was a famous cartoonist. I met him at Pune just couple of months prior to his demise. He explained me his works in detail with an enthusiasm of a nine year old. His tips about flow and compositions were unique.

About three years ago, I got in touch with Shri Satish Acharya. He is an editorial cartoonist, always drawing with clear lines and vibrant colours. Being an editorial cartoonist is a difficult preposition. He brings out absurdity in a very subtle manner. He continues to guide me even today.



I have another mentor- Shri Ghanashyam Deshmukh. His cartoons are based on the daily routine. Though majority of his work is in Marathi, his art is and sense of humour is amazing. He is an accomplished artist who has a very versatile approach to the art. It is reflected in his creations.

I came across Shri Vivek Prabhukeluskar this year at Cartoonists Combine event. He is an artist, who has excelled in different formats including cartoons. He suggested me certain basic things like holding of pen/pencil. These were so simple and basic yet I had never noticed those.

And then there are certain artists from our fauji clan. Captain Anshuman Chatterjee, Col Ramesh who are inspirations. I have not met either of them yet like many I simply adore their creativity. Some day I am sure I shall meet them in person and learn a few more things. It is always a great learning experience.

## IQ: Any important life lessons you learnt while drawing cartoons for the ForceNet E-Zine?

Amit: The first and foremost learning is that it is indeed "A Network that Works". There was a period in my journey when everything was going astray. The only cartoons I drew in those days were for - The ForceNet e- Magazine. Rather I used to look forward to hear from Capt Rajesh, the editor, about the new theme.

So the process of drawing cartoons for our e-magazine has seen me through the thick and thin, it helped me to tide over through the hard times. It taught me not to give up and keep on toiling hard.



IQ: What are the ingredients that go into the making of a good Cartoonist? What are the skills, information, knowledge a good cartoonist needs to have?

**Amit:** (Following I would like to imbibe to reach to the next level. I am a learner and my response is from that perspective)

Cartoons are meant to bring a smile so a good sense of humour is the most important ingredient. A witty line or a crisp picture can change the outlook. Ability to see a tough situation differently and to express it without hurting anyone is the ultimate asset for any cartoonist.

Along with sense of humour, cartoonist has to be frugal. Ability to say maximum with minimum. Be it lines or the caption or the punch line, use of too many kills the cat. Shri RK Laxman conveys far more with very few strokes of the brush. Shri SD Fadnis has rarely used even a punchline. Back home, if we go through Cdr Ramesh's recent series on Postings, he too conveys so much in his creations with so much less.

In skills, observation plays important role. Simple thing like shadow or creases on shirt can bring vibrancy to a sketch.

Subject knowledge too plays an important role. A Captain of Navy vis a vis that of Army have nothing in common except for the casual leave availed in the calendar year.

Also the language matters. The language pilots speak with the ATC and that a gunner speaks with the Gun Position Officer are different not only in the choice of the words but also the grammar of it.

Cartoons are very flexible and forgiving as far as size, shape and figures are concerned yet not every cartoonist is able to strike a chord with readers.

IQ: What would be your message to any of the military personnel or veterans who wish to take up cartoonist either as a hobby or as a profession?

**Amit:** For serving, military career is full adventures. Rarely there will be a dull day. So if you just doodle it down to a few lines, faces or even objects it is a good stress buster.

For those **who have hung the boots**, there has never been a more wonderful time than now to bash on regardless.

Only precaution one can take is be discrete. Washing dirty linen in public may best be avoided. I leave it at that



# IQ: Tell us about your family. What role did your parents play in shaping your value system. Also share the role played by your family including spouse in your career?

**Amit:** Family has been a great support.

Ladies of our household are teachers. My mother and wife both have been teachers. So education remains the P1. My father was a judge before shifting to banking. His life revolved around basic principles of honesty, loyalty and integrity. Childhood was never lavish but was well provided for. While growing up, were always kept on our toes. It all came handy later on in life.



As I said earlier, I am really blessed.










One Word To Describe Forces Network

  - They demonstrate to the corporate world the entrepreneurial spirit and business acumen that veterans possess.





# YEMEN: THE CIVIL WAR, HUMANITARIAN CRISIS AND RESOLUTION

#### Introduction

Until the beginning of the Russian-Ukraine conflict, the Yemeni civil war was much in the news. On 24 February 2022, Russia declared war on Ukraine. The advancement of the mighty Russian Army into Ukraine was a countermagnet to the Yemeni Civil War, and this news retreated and faded away from the media and thus from human memory. All significant resources and funding to contain the civil war and the humanitarian crisis that had thus arisen were diverted to a war that had worldwide ramifications. The Yemenis or the Yemenites were left 'High and Dry'.

#### Yemen's Geostrategic Significance

History is replete with examples of how a country's strategic location can become a bane instead of a boon. Yemen, because of its geostrategic positioning, was and is no different. Domestic unrest supported by foreign powers seeking a foothold in Yemen led to conflicts that plunged the country into revolts and civil wars.

Yemen's position in the Arabian Sea, the Gulf of Aden, the Red Sea, and other strategic islands gives it a vantage point on the Strait of Bab al-Mandab. This strait serves as a gateway connecting the Indian Ocean and the Arabian Sea to the Mediterranean Sea, thus controlling major trade and oil routes between the East and the West. The geographical location is of immense importance to international stakeholders for strategic, political, and economic benefits. Saudi Arabia and Iran, being its immediate neighbours, have more enormous stakes



in it and thus are constantly vying to gain control covertly or overtly over Yemen's strategic location to consolidate their regional influence and superiority.

#### Genesis of the Crisis

As was prevalent in the Sultanates, Imamates and the monarchial states of the Middle East, the Yemenis also had their share of uprisings, revolts, assassination attempts, and coup d'états. The ruling Imam, Mohammed-Al-Badr, was finally disposed of in 1962. Abdullah Yahya Al-Saleh, an officer in the Yemen Army, led the coup with his cohort of military officers and established a republic. Badr had survived the assault on his palace in Sanaa' and organised a coalition of the tribals against the republican government. Saleh desperately appealed to Egypt; thus, the first Egyptian troops set foot in Yemen. On the other hand, Saudi Arabia, driven by tribal border considerations, previous agreements with the Imamate, and the presence of Egyptian troops, supported the opposition. The battleground between Egyptian President Abdel-Al-Naser and Al-Badr was transformed into an international conflict and diplomacy.

Yemen at that time was divided into the North and South Yemen. Although the North was predominantly republican Shias, the South was Marxist Sunnis under the influence of the USSR.

From 1962 onwards, Saleh tried desperately to put in a unification treaty between the South and the North and, in 1990, managed the unification of Yemen. However, his attempt was unsuccessful, as the Civil War broke out in 1994. Nevertheless, he emerged victorious and tried to strengthen his position, hoping his son would take over. This proposal faced strong opposition from his Vice President and Army Chief, AbdRabbuh Mansur Hadi, whom he wanted to replace.

Al Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) had, in the meantime, become influential in Yemen. On 12 October 2000, the AQAP carried out a suicide attack on the USS Cole off the Port of Aden, in which seventeen US service personnel were killed. Since then, the American Senate has granted Yemen \$850 million in aid to conduct counterterrorism operations.

By this time, there was large-scale unrest and civil disobedience in Yemen against the rising prices, inflation and Sunni Islamisation influence from the South. In the North, the Houthis, a sect of Shi'a Muslims supported by Iran, started gaining prominence in the politics of Yemen. Under the leadership of



Zaidi religious leader Hussein al-Houthi, the Houthis emerged as an opposition movement to Yemen President Ali Abdullah Saleh, whom they accused of corruption and being backed by Saudi Arabia and the United States. As the influence of the Houthis increased in the North, the South was being overrun by Al Qaeda. Saleh was still trying to get his son to take over as the Army Chief, which led to clashes between the forces loyal to him and Hadi. As a result, the once-powerful Army of Yemen became weak and directionless and was unable to stop the onslaught of the now-powerful Houthis from the North. With almost no resistance being offered by the Yemeni Army or forces loyal to Hadi, who was now the President of Yemen, the Houthis captured Sana'a, the capital of Yemen, on 24th September 2014. This led to the resignation of Prime Minister Mohammed Basindawa and later the resignation of President Abdrabbuh Mansur Hadi and his ministers on 22 January 2015 after Houthi forces seized the presidential palace, residence, and vital military installations, and the formation of a ruling council by Houthi militants on 6 February 2015.

In the same year, Saudi Arabia formed a coalition of Sunni-majority Arab states to intervene in the Yemeni civil war. The coalition includes: Bahrain, Egypt, Jordan, Kuwait, Morocco, Qatar, Sudan, The United Arab Emirates (UAE).

The United States, United Kingdom, France, and Canada back the coalition. Western countries, including the United States, the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Italy, and Canada, have also sold arms to Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and other coalition members. Thus making this war murkier with international players and stakeholders.

To reign in the Houthis, Saudi Arabia and the UAE have been leading an air campaign in Yemen since 2015 and have carried out more than 30,000 airstrikes in Yemen, with around 28% of those strikes targeting civilian areas. According to the Armed Conflict Location and Event Data Project (ACLED), the air campaign has killed almost 24,000 people, including nearly 9,000 civilians.

A persistent conflict between the Internationally Recognized Government of Yemen (IRG), with support from the Saudi-led coalition, and the de-facto authority (DFA) (also known as the Houthis) that is aligned with Iran has resulted in a severe economic and humanitarian crisis.



#### **Humanitarian Crisis**

The situation in Yemen remains the world's worst humanitarian crisis. The conflict has caused at least 377,000 deaths and has forcibly uprooted more than 4.5 million people from their homes. Over one-third of the three million refugees have been displaced within Yemen since 2015, and 2022 alone saw 234,000 new displacements. Millions of people are scattered in camps for displaced persons with little food and poor hygiene. Yemen remains among the top six largest internal displacements in the world.

As per UNHCR estimates, 17 million people—more than half of the population are suffering from high levels of food insecurity. The conflict and economic collapse have significantly damaged public services, which were already limited in Yemen. Only 50 per cent of health facilities and 65 per cent of schools are currently functioning, leaving more than 2 million children out of school. Nearly 90 per cent of the population has no access to publicly supplied electricity. Key public service employees, including Yemeni health workers and two-thirds of all Yemeni teachers, have not received a regular salary in years.

The UNHCR estimates that about 76%, or 21.6 million people, need human assistance and protection services. This is believed to be the worst humanitarian crisis in the world.

Medical supplies are chronically short, and only half of health facilities fully function. In 2017, the country suffered the largest-ever outbreak of cholera since records began. More than a million people were thought to have contracted it that year; at least 3,000 people died.

The COVID-19 pandemic has further compounded the situation. The health workers estimate that the figures available may be only 70% of the actual cases reported. Many affected areas do not have the available basic medical facilities, so the figures reported are inaccurate. Yemen hosts around 99,877 refugees and asylum seekers, 70 per cent of whom are Somali and 20 per cent Ethiopian - making Yemen the world's fourth largest host of Somali refugees. Much of the refugee and asylum-seeking population live in unsuitable accommodations without access to water in the overcrowded and impoverished neighbourhoods of Aden and Sana'a.

#### International Response to the Humanitarian Crisis

The inter-agency humanitarian evaluation (IAHE) covered one of the largest and most significant humanitarian responses by Inter-Agency Standing



Committee (IASC) partners. The review found that despite multiple political, bureaucratic, and geographical challenges, the humanitarian response in Yemen scaled up impressively and slowed the collapse of essential services. In so doing, lives were saved and suffering alleviated.

Although these may be some positive signs, the overall situation in Yemen remains critical. Continued fighting prevents shipments of food and fuel from entering the country. Hospitals do not have diesel fuel to operate generators during power cuts, and ambulances have run out of gasoline. Stocks of antibiotics and critical medical supplies have been depleted. Large-scale corruption in distributing aid material is a significant challenge for the agencies. The danger to the lives of the aid workers and collateral damage are impediments to the smooth flow of food, medical care items and protection. The conflict in Yemen drew international response both in terms of military assistance as well as humanitarian aid. Various agencies have been working relentlessly in Yemen to mitigate the hardships of the conflict. Some of the principal agencies are listed below.

The United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), now UNCF, is helping treat severe acute malnutrition in children by providing essential therapeutic food and medical supplies. Children are also being helped with victim assistance and education on mines and explosive remnants of war.

The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) supports, Interventions, including emergency food assistance, Medical treatment and vaccination support for children, Emergency obstetric services for women, Blankets and household goods for displaced families, Hygiene kits and water treatment supplies to reduce the spread of disease.

USAID partners support populations in need across Yemen by providing access to safe drinking water, emergency food assistance, malnutrition screening and treatment, primary health care services, and protection support. The United Nations Population Fund's (UNPF) priority is to ensure that all Yemeni women and girls can access services vital to their health, well-being, and lives. As part of the Yemen Humanitarian Response Plan, UNPF delivers: Reproductive health services, with a focus on emergency obstetric and neonatal care to, reduce maternal mortality and morbidity. Protection services for women and girls to prevent and respond to different forms of violence. Emergency life-saving packages for all newly displaced persons through the Rapid Response Mechanism.



The United Nations High Commissioner (UNHCR) for Refugees leads the Protection, Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM), and Shelter/Non-Food Items clusters as part of the inter-agency humanitarian response to assist those most in need in Yemen. In addition, UNHCR remains the only agency addressing the protection and well-being of refugees and asylum-seekers nationwide. UNHCR's response focuses primarily on protection interventions, shelter support, CCCM services, cash assistance, peaceful coexistence and social cohesion projects, and comprehensive refugee response. Today, the Operation has a well-established presence across the country. It covers most of its 22 governorates and 333 districts.

Save the Children has been working in Yemen since 1963 as one of the largest aid organisations in the country. Since March 2015, it has reached more than 5 million children in Yemen with life-saving assistance. It supports over 200 health facilities across Yemen to deliver vital nutrition services for babies, children, and mothers. Islamic Relief is a leading humanitarian organisation in Yemen, with thousands of field staff and volunteers nationwide. Their projects include Life-saving food aid, Access to clean water and sanitation, Sustainable livelihood efforts, health response for cholera, emergency aid for internally displaced people, and winter solutions to the Conflict.

Other than material and human resources, including a skilled workforce, The United States, Saudi Arabia, Germany, and the European Union were the top four donors last year.

#### **Ending the Conflict**

Many resolutions resulting from meetings and negotiations have yet to arrive at a lasting peace or solution to the six-decade-old conflict. The fundamental challenge in achieving a sustainable resolution of the current conflict in Yemen is that the issues at stake are fundamental to Yemen's identity and history. It is also true that no effort—domestic, regional, or international—to address Yemen's persistent issues of political disenfranchisement, economic marginalisation, and social inequity has succeeded. But the more significant effort to find a durable end to the conflict and establish a path to an overarching political resolution has been mainly left to the United Nations and other international actors.

At a time when the United States is focused on responding to Russia's war in Ukraine and stepping up efforts to deal with China and climate change, the Yemen war remains a challenge for regional and global security, and the conflict represents one of the worst humanitarian crises in the world.



No mediation effort to go beyond CBMs, whether domestic, regional, or international, can succeed without knowing that the Houthis military adventure has ended. Thus, the principal challenge for potential negotiators is to find the means to apply pressure on the Houthis.

The recent launch of Houthi Drone missiles into the Red Sea also signals that the failure to prevent a Houthi military victory in Yemen will present a sustained threat to freedom of navigation in the Red Sea and Bab el-Mandeb. With some 10% of the world's maritime commerce passing through that vital waterway, global trade and economy depend on maintaining it as a secure sea line of communication.

Internationally, the UN has listed specific steps that can be taken to ensure the resolution of conflict, lasting peace, and the reconstruction of Yemen, which have been discussed during Yemeni negotiations. Support the new U.N. initiative to expand the scope of consultations to include key Yemeni stakeholders, including civil society, women's and youth groups, tribes, southerners, the diaspora, and others.

Sustain efforts to achieve a comprehensive ceasefire between the Houthis and government-aligned forces, including reopening the Sana'a airport and, relieving blocks on Hodeida port and holding the parties accountable for their response. Make clear that the Houthis will not be accepted as a legitimate participant in negotiations while they continue their military operations in Yemen and across the border. Re-designate the Houthis as a Foreign Terrorist Organization (FTO) if they continue to resist efforts to advance the political negotiations to end the fighting or use the cover of talks to continue their military campaign.

Engage the Saudi and Emirati leadership to encourage their continued efforts to promote a unified Yemeni leadership committed to resisting Houthi aggression, finding a peaceful resolution to the conflict, and paving the way for resolving longstanding Yemeni grievances. Ensure their commitment and buy-in in the post-war reconstruction and redevelopment process.

Continue to coordinate closely to address Saudi and Emirati security concerns, including the provision of needed weapons to defend against Houthi cross-border attacks, while emphasising the need to seek an end to coalition military operations within the context of an overall ceasefire, including an end to Houthi cross-border operations.



Address problems in economic management in government-held areas to eliminate corruption, reduce inflation, and resolve obstacles to the economy; strengthen the performance of commercial banks; stabilise the Yemeni riyal; and promote U.N. mediation on economic issues to end economic dislocations that victimise innocent civilians.

With the IMF and World Bank, advanced mechanisms to restart oil and gas exports with revenues to fund essential services, pay civil servant salaries and fund the Social Fund for Development. Make clear to the Houthis that the U.S. will respond kinetically to further actions that threaten freedom of navigation in the Red Sea, Bab el-Mandeb, or the Gulf of Aden.

#### Conclusion






